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St. Mary's University College graduated 4,224 distance education students with diploma in 15 different fields of studies on 25 February 2006. The ceremony was simultaneously held at four different regional cities, i.e. Addis Ababa (995), Bahir Dar- Amhara- (1,167), Adama/Nazareth--Oromia- (1,181) and Awassa – SNNPR- (881). These numbers make the total number of the University College distance education graduates so far 6,991.



President and Founder of the University College, Ato Wondwosen Tamrat in Addis Ababa and the University College representatives at Bahar Dar ,Adama / Nazareth and at Awassa expressed the complexity of distance education and the multi-faceted challenges it poses particularly to students in developing coutries like Ethiopia. Enormous gratitude were also made to their families for the support they rendered to their respective family members. The need for effective leadership and managerial approach were mentioned by the resource persons as essentials to place a disciplined academic work.


The Five Year Strategic Plan at SMUC

Salesmanship in Action




The Department of Marketing Management has established the tradition of holding an annual trade show to supplement students' classroom-based theoretical lessons with practical business transactions.

PARTICIPATION

International Experience Sharing



Teacher trainees of different teacher training institutions from The Netherlands came to SMUC on experience sharing programme from the April 24 – May 5, 2006.

The programme was arranged and facilitated by Education Foundation (in the Netherlands) and by Jerusalem Children and Community Development Organization (JCCDO), a local NGO.

The mission of the experience sharing programme was to exchange ideas and enhace transfer of knowledge on the curricula, teaching/learning activities, teaching methodologies and other related matters.



To that effect, on 26 April 2006, faculty leaders, office heads, and students of the Faculty of Education welcomed 28 Dutch teacher training trainees at Mexico Campus.





The acquaintance and experience sharing activities took place at the Multi – Purpose Hall- Mexico Campus- where one Ethiopian trainee sat with one Dutch trainee around a table.



General briefings were given by Ato Melaku Girma, the Faculty Dean, and by Ato Bekalu Atinafu, Head of the Education Department, on'Historical Development of the Ethiopian Education System', 'Synopsis of the Teacher Education Programme in Ethiopia', 'The Teacher Education Programme at St. Mary's University College' and 'Running the Practicum in Ethiopian Schools'. Karen Waters- HDP Leader at SMUC- also gave a talk on 'The Higher Diploma Programme (HDP) in Ethiopia'.





In their turn, the group leaders of the Dutch trainees, Frits Kruiswijk, Campaign Manager, and other two women-trainees gave short and general introduction about the institutes they have come from.



Relaxed and friendly talks, discussions and exchange of ideas continued accompanied by laughters, smiles and camera shots.

The two groups together visited elementary schools in Addis Ababa among which were *Kidus Raguel, John F. Kennedy, Bete – Mengist, Yettibeb – Menged.*

They also visited the ethnographical museum at *Sidist – Killo, Kidus Raguel Church* and the homes of some poor students.

The trainees from the Netherlands and SMUC including school teachers of *Tibeb Menged* played field hockey (similar to our traditional *gena* game). Finally, a farewell party was given by Jerusalem Children and Community Development Organization (JCCDA) on May 5, 2006 at Ras Amba Hotel.

During the farewell party, all the trainees reflected on the experience sharing programme in groups. Group leaders noted that the experience sharing program was a great opportunity to understand each other's culture, and to learn helpful methodologies.

WORKSHOPS AND CONFERENCES

Enriching the National Youth Policy

St. Mary's University College participated in the three–day national consultative workshop organized by the Ministry of Youth and Sport (MOYS) from Feb. 16 - 18, 2006 at Ghion Hotel.

The work shop was meant to enrich and finalize two documents: 'the ten-year Multi Sectoral Youth Development Strategic Plan (MYDSP)' and the 'Youth Sector Development Plan (MYDSP)'. The University College was represented by Ato Abrham Getachew, an expert at the Center for Research and Quality Assurance (CRQA).

The representative contributed his share in the 'Capacity Building' group; where the role of private education institutions in youth capacity building was emphasized.

Workshop of Engineering Capacity Development Program (ECBP)

The Center for Research and Quality Assurance (CRQA) of the University College participated in the 'National Planning Workshop of Engineering Capacity Development Programe (ECBP)' organized by Ministry of Capacity Building and GTZ. It was conducted in Addis Ababa from March 9 - 10 and from 16 - 17, 2006 to deliberate on the summary reports of Addis Ababa regional workshop and of the national workshop respectively.

The five key issues which were the focus areas of discussion for the TVET working group where Ato abraham Getachew, an expert at CRQA participated were: TVET Policy and system development, standardization, testing and certification (OSAC), training & upgrading of technical teachers & institution, support for public & non – public TVET institutions, and promote co-operative & in company training. Finally, the need for close links and cooperation between industries and universities/higher institutions, and the vitality of considering 'intelligence development' that creates market (demand) were some of the issues noted by the workshop participants.

Public-Private Partnership (PPP) for the Ethiopian Higher Education Institutions

St. Mary's University College participated on the one-day consultative workshop conducted by Higher Education Strategy Center (HESC) -MOE- and PHEIs focusing on 'Public-Private Partnership of the Ethiopian Higher Education Institutions' at Desalegn Hotel, Addis Ababa on June 1, 2006.

The workshop was opened by Dr. Tesfaye Teshome, HERQ Director. The objectives of the workshop were to identify options that bring relevance and quality education both in public and private HEIs; to create shared vision and responsibilities among HEIs an finally; to explore and define policy options for partnership between private and public HEIs.

The discussion focused on a project paper 'Public- Private Partnership (PPP) of the Ethiopian Higher Education Institutions'. Finally, participants recommended that the paper be further enriched and the comments be included.

International Conference

The Center for Research and Quality Assurance (CRQA) of the SMUC participated in an international conference on the theme 'Strategies for Peace with Development: the Role of Education, Training and Research' from June 12 - 14 2006 at the Headquarter of the African Union in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia.

The conference was attended by participants drawn from all of the sub-regions of the African continent representing 26 African countries, Representatives from Europe, the U-Peace Office in Geneva, the U-Peace Main Campus in Costa Rica, and from other development agencies; and international organizations in Africa and beyond.

The conference sought to achieve two major objectives: to focus policy attention on strategies to integrate peace with development; and to identify specific needs and strategy follow–up activities where education, training, research and the dissemination of knowledge can be focused to advance peace and development.

During the three days discussion and analysis, key conclusions that constitute the bases for recommendations were made. A number of these recommendations will be incorporated in the plan of Action for the AU's Second Decade of Education for Africa – to be launched in September 2006.

Legal Education and Training Discussion Programme

The University College participated in the 'Legal Education and Training Reform Discussion Programme' conducted on May 29 - 30, 2006 at the Ministry of Capacity Biulding.

The objectives of the programme were to present and discuss the draft document for the 'Reform of Legal Education and Training in Ethiopia'; and to obtain feedback from stakeholders.

The programme was opened by Ato Tefera Walwa, Minister of Capacity Building.

The deans of law faculties of all participating institutions shared their reflections on European and American Universities. The major part of the presentation involved problems in legal education and minimum standards that are to be observed as from September 2006. Accordingly, constructive comments were given on the issues discused.

After questions and suggestions were entertained, the programme was closed by Ato Tefera Walwa, Minister of Capacity Building.

World Environment Day

The External Relations Office (ERO) of the University College attended both the Addis Ababa Green Award (at the Addis Ababa City Hall in the morning) and the National Green Award (at the National Palace in the afternoon) Program Presentation Ceremonies on June 5, 2006 - World Environment Day.

Both programmes were organized by Forum for Environment under the patronage of HE Girma Woldegiorgis, President of FDRE.

At the event, those who demonstrated outstanding environmental efforts and activities in the country were awarded.

A drama performance that vividly depicted the disastrous impact of deforestation on the Ethiopian population was presented in both events and left most of the participants in tears.

Community Concern



Members of the Welfare Association Club at SMUC have been involving themselves in welfare activities targeting the needy since 1996 E.C.



As a tradition that has been in place for years, members of the Association, collect money and clothings annually from the University College community and go out to the streets and hospitals of Addis Ababa, together with the Student Affairs Office and the Student Union to accomplish their noble objectives.



Accordingly, they went out to the streets and distributed the clothing items to street dwellers on April 10,2006



Again, on 22 April 2006, the club members and organizers of the charity went to the Addis Ababa City hospitals and to *Entoto Mariam* Church to visit the sick. They served them with fruit-juice in the middle of consoling talks and gave them post-cards to demonstrate their concern and sympathy. Candles were also lit to communicate hope in the hearts of the sick and the destitutes.
