Capacity Building

In a bid to strengthen its academic and administrative wings, the college has signed various agreements with different agencies.

An agreement with a local computer network agency was signed to automate the Registrar, Finance and the Program Offices so that better and efficient services could be rendered. As part of this initiative, networking and automating the systems of the Distance Education Students' data and other services are underway.

Consultancy and research works are very vital in enriching, particularly, the teaching/learning process. The college has signed a memorandum of understanding with Nile Consulting Group a local consulting group—that provides research and consultancy services. The agreement includes a joint venture in research and consultancy related activities.

Short Term Training

In addition to the conventional teaching/learning process the College has embarked on offering training to employees in the civil service. Accordingly, very recently, the college offered short term training to the staff of Road Transport Authority, Addis Ababa on Time and Materials Management tailored to the specific needs of the authority. Moreover, the College gave a three - month in-service training for 15 library employees through a special arrangement to up-grade the services of the Lideta Campus and Mexico Campus libraries. The training was offered by professional librarians from the various branches of Addis Ababa University.

The Need for Hands-on Experience

In an extraordinary show of teamwork, heads of the departments of Education, Languages, Mathematics and Basic Sciences, and Social Science have developed a seventy-three page practicum manual, which will be used as a guideline to classroom based observation and teaching practice. Their achievement owes much to the synergistic effort they put into their work. In a similar development, the Department of Law has produced the draft guidelines to gear up Moot Court Competition and made the necessary arrangements which is one of the requirements for securing accreditation for the degree program.

Students have formed their council which consists of 7 members as executive body. Each member of the executive body has duties and responsibilities of organizing different committees in which member students could develop their hobbies and interests, exercise various social commitments and learn how to solve problems and misunderstandings through discussions.

Social Commitment

The college community in general and the students in particular have really shown their profound desire and interest to contribute their shares to the needy.

A month ago, when untimely rain was a threat to the crops of farmers on the fields, the college wrote a letter to Oromia Regional State, Office of the President, expressing the students' desire to help the farmers in collecting their crops. Activities of self-initiated students to create awareness in the society and to help the needy are becoming very common and encouraging in our college. This is really a promising gesture as it shows the concern of the youth a social force to be reckoned with.

Beginning August 2003, a group of students formed a committee to collect clothes intended for the homeless from students, instructors and the administrative staff. The committee was able to collect 390 different clothing items.

Netsanet Fettene, a female student in the Extension Program, in the Department of Computer Science, initiated an idea to visit patients in hospitals during Christmas.

Through the joint efforts of a committee set up by students and the student Affairs Office of the College about 4,000.00 Birr was collected from the college community.

The committee bought fruits and, together with volunteer students, visited patients at the Black Lion, Fistula, Zewditu, Yekatit, Ras Desta, St. Paul and Menelike II hospitals on the eve of Ethiopian Christmas while the other committee again, along with the college students, distributed the clothes to the homeless. Students also presented Christmas Cards to the patients.

The college is really proud of the social concern of students, and the collaboration of the instructors and the administrative personnel. The college community should keep up this spirit.
