Teaching and Learning

St. Mary's University Celebrates the Achievements of Its Graduates

S t. Mary's University conferred degrees on its undergraduate and postgraduate students on March 9, 2024, at the Ethiopian National Theatre.



In his keynote address, Wondwosen Tamrat, (Ph.D., Associate Professor), the Founder and President of the University, extended heartfelt congratulations to the graduates for their commendable academic achievements.

The President acknowledged the graduates' dedication and the unwavering support of the faculty and staff, which were instrumental in the students' successful academic journey. He emphasized that the University's commitment to education, research, and community service has been pivotal in nurturing thousands of professionals over the past quarter-century, thereby significantly contributing to the nation's progress.

Reflecting on the University's enduring legacy of excellence, the President announced that this year, 142 postgraduates and 344 undergraduate students, totaling 486 graduates have met the rigorous academic standards and national examination requirements to be presented as candidates for graduation. The gender distribution among the graduates is noteworthy, with 45.8% of postgraduate and 45.9% of undergraduate degrees awarded to male students, while female students comprised 54.2% and 54% of the respective cohorts.



The President highlighted that this year's graduation statistic underscores a remarkable increase in female participation and achievement, which exemplifies the University's outstanding performance in fostering gender equity in higher education.





"In preparation for today's graduation, extensive efforts have been made over the past years. Following the Ministry of Education's directives, our undergraduate candidates have been meticulously trained in their respective competencies. This rigorous preparation was essential for qualifying for the National Higher Education Exit Exam. Notably, St. Mary's University, the sole private institution to surpass a 50% graduate pass rate in last year's exam, has once again achieved commendable results, continuing its legacy of success," he remarked.



The guest of honor, Dr. Tewabech Bishaw, Founder and Managing Director of Alliance for Brain Gain and Innovative Development (ABIDE), had the honor of presenting awards to academically distinguished graduates.

In her closing remarks, the guest of honor imparted sage advice, urging the graduates to aspire to greatness by embracing values of equality, unity, respect, tolerance, empathy, and love-virtues our nation dearly requires. She emphasized that the graduates' future success hinges on patriotic fervor, a positive outlook, fairness, integrity, dedication, and a robust work ethic. "Your vision will be clear, and your mission accomplished, as long as you apply your education with zeal and wisdom," she affirmed. "The ceremony was not only a festivity of scholastic achievements but also a recognition of diligence and commitment," She reaffirmed.



The event reached its zenith with a commemorative photo session capturing the moment shared between the senate members and the graduates.

St. Mary's University Embarks on 4th Strategic Plan Development

St. Mary's University has commenced the development of its 4th Strategic Plan with a briefing session held for the Steering Committee members on February 22, 2024 at the Syndicate Room, Main Campus. The session was opened by Desalegn Berie, Vice President for Business Administration and Chairman of the Senate Standing Committee for Resource and Planning Development.

The event featured presentations from Misganaw Solomon, PhD, Vice President for Research and International Relations, and Shegaw G/Medhin, Director of the Center for Educational Improvement and Quality Assurance. The presentation outlined the University's strategic direction, emphasizing the goal to prepare a well-articulated plan that embodies SMU's motto – "Committed to Excellence!"

During the presentation, it was disclosed that three strategic plans have been developed, and Currently, the third is being implemented. The session underscored the strategic planning process as a critical tool for mapping the Institution's growth trajectory, informing decisions, and defining longterm objectives.

It was explained that the 4th Strategic Plan process includes a comprehensive review of the existing plan, identification of key steps and resources, and clarification of expected outputs within set deadlines. The plan's focus areas include SWOT Analysis, Stakeholders' Analysis, Environment Scanning, and Basic Data Compilation.

The process will proceed with the development of an action plan, assignment of responsibilities, understanding of tasks and outcomes, re-planning and resource identification, and creation of data collection instruments. This will be followed by information gathering, drafting of committee reports, compilation of findings, and presentation of drafts for feedback. The final stages involve revising, editing, and finalizing the document, submitting it to the Senate Standing Committee for Resource and Planning Development, and presenting the final Strategic Plan to the Senate for approval.



Comprehensive Thesis Preparation Orientation

St. Mary's University's Student Support Service Office (SGS) organized a half-day orientation session for second-batch (Entrant-B) postgraduate program students, focusing on thesis preparation. The event, which took place on March 16th, 2024, aimed to equip students with vital information and tools for their research journey.

The orientation featured experts from various departments, including the School of Graduate Studies, Institute of Agriculture and Development Studies, Student Support Service Office, and Research and Knowledge Management Office. They provided insights into the University's thematic research areas, thesis writing techniques, and the significance of ethical research practices.



Key topics covered include the structure and format of a thesis, clarity in academic writing, and adherence to institutional guidelines. The session also highlighted resources available to students for their research endeavors.

The interactive event concluded with a Q&A session, where students actively participated and received personalized advice and further clarification on their queries.

Engaging Sessions on Data Science and Cloud Computing

St. Mary's University's Computer Science Club, in collaboration with the Google Developer Students Club (GDSC), organized two enriching events at the American Corner on March 14 and 26, 2024. These sessions were designed to expand the horizons of tech enthusiast students about the cutting-edge fields of data science and cloud computing.



The first event, led by Bemnet Girma, a data scientist, who provided an introduction to the world of data science. His presentation was not only educational but also deeply inspiring, as he shared his personal experiences and career journey. His insights proved invaluable, leaving the students motivated and equipped with new perspectives on harnessing data for innovation.

A successive session was held on March 26, 2024, with Bereket Negash, a cloud expert, featured the world of cloud computing. His presentations unraveled the complexities of cloud technologies, offering students a comprehensive understanding of the subject. The session culminated in an interactive interview, where Bereket elaborated on the nuances of cloud computing. A vibrant Q&A session followed, sparking discussions that left attendees with new insights and ideas.

Her Excellency Naome Fellos, the Public Diplomacy Counsellor of the US Embassy Addis Ababa, described the event as a collaborative effort among the US Embassy Addis Ababa, St. Mary's University, and the Ethiopian World Federation. She acknowledged the commitment of these partners in making this graduation program possible.

Wondwosen Tamrat, Ph.D., in his remarks, congratulated the trainees who successfully completed their special training on animation after three months of hard work at the American Corner, which St. Mary's University has been hosting since May 2023.



He expressed his pleasure in hosting this vibrant center, emphasizing its rapid growth since its establishment. "Over the past 8 months, the center has become a valuable hub for information, skill training, and networking. The two-decade partnership between the US Embassy and St. Mary's University holds significant value for Ethiopian youth and job creation," he remarked.

His Excellency Ambros R. King, President of the Ethiopian World Federation Association, highlighted that this Imagining, Animation, and Media Educational project exemplifies the unity between Ethiopia and the United States of America. It draws upon a rich history of spiritual and cultural ties dating back to the 1800s and 1900s.

Her Excellency Nebiah Mohammed, the State Minister of Labor & Skills emphasized the significant potential of the creative art industry in driving economic transformation and creating quality employment opportunities, especially for youth. She expressed her gratitude on behalf of the ministry to the US Embassy and St. Mary's University for their consistent support, which has played a crucial role in youth development and fostering innovation through such programs as Digital Animation Training.



As a culmination of their hard work, 45 students were awarded certificates of participation in the training. They also showcased their animation pieces of work, celebrating their achievements and the impact of this valuable initiative.

Digital Learning Platform Project

On February 10, 2024, a closing ceremony was held at the Syndicate Room of St. Mary's University (SMU) to mark the completion of the project "Digital Learning Platform of the Ethiopian Education System". The project was funded by DEG Deutsche Investitions-und Enticklungsellschaft mbH, a German development finance institution, and implemented by suPPPort Ltd., an international consultancy and service provider with offices in Hong Kong, Bangladesh, and Germany.

The ceremony began with a welcoming speech by SMU President, Wondwosen Tamrat (PhD, Assoc. Prof.), who remarked that the impact of the partnership was immense for SMU's digitization and that it was quite remarkable that it catered education for more than 6000 students through its distance learning program. He also expressed SMU's commitment to ensuring the continuity of the project and its aspiration to remain more digitized and paperless. He noted that the lesson learned from the project was more than what was anticipated and hoped the partnership would continue in the years to come.

The event continued with a briefing about the project by Misganaw Solomon (PhD), who discussed the objectives and outcomes of the SMU-DEG-support joint initiative. The project, which started on March 31, 2020, and lasted for three years, aimed to improve SMU's delivery of educational services, especially its digital system and infrastructure. As a result of the project, 13 distance-learning centers have been upgraded; student enrolment in 5 undergraduate and 4 graduate programs has increased; and the learning process has been streamlined and made easier for educators and learners to access and manage educational content. The project also enabled learners to access educational materials and courses from anywhere with an internet connection, which is particularly valuable for remote learning, distance education, and corporate training programs.

Suraya Akter, General Manager of Support Ltd, acknowledged and commended the University's commitment to the realization of the project and promised that the partnership would continue. Finally, a vote of thanks was given to Ozan Oezdemir and Suraya Akter and their team, who played instrumental roles in the inception and implementation of the project.
